<u>CALL to PRAYER</u> - On this Lord's Day let us return thanks for the Lord's salvation - Jonah 2:9c

John 19:30 - Paid in Full

<u>INTRO</u> - The Gospel of God is about the Person and work of Jesus Christ of Nazareth. <u>Jesus is the good news</u>. He is the only good Person, & He fully accomplished the good work of salvation. The Gospel is about: God becoming man...doing a work as a Man...that only God could do. This work was of eternal weight & of eternal consequence...and this work got done...completed Jesus' work is like His word – you can't add to it or take away from it. It is finished/done/accomplished Everything we do in this world feels unfinished, it is always in flux and needs fixing/tweaking. We live in a never-ending cycle of incompletion. The Good News is that salvation is complete. <u>IT IS FINISHED!</u> The Gospel calls us to have faith in what is finished & in *WHO* finished it. The preacher is to persuade sinners that punishment for sin has been <u>paid in full</u> by the God-Man Jesus Christ. FINAL WORDS IT IS FINISHED FAITH IN WHAT IS FINISHED

FINAL WORDS

Jesus uttered seven sayings while on the cross. The Sacred 7 CrossWords

1. Relinquish Luke 23:34

a. Jesus was giving the forgiving over to the Father. Not get even but sent it to heaven

2. Responsibility John 19:26-27

a. Arranges for the physical and spiritual care of His mother

3. Reassure Luke 23:42-43

a. Promises the repentant thief Paradise. No delay when he die but go directly to paradise

4. Rejection Mark 15:33-34 (Matt. 27:45-46)

a. The Son of God and Substitute for sinners is forsaken for them

- 5. Remembrance John 19:28
 - a. He remembers every detail of the decreed happenings and sufferings
- 6. Re_____
 - a. After accomplishing every element & act of righteousness required by the Father
 - b. ...after enduring the crushing totality of countess eternities of punishment...
 - c. The cry is heard "It is Finished" The debt is paid and paid in full
 - d. Redemption is word about payment liabilities are covered & debts are done
 - i. The cost of being forgiven is the price paid in Redemption

IT IS FINISHED

- These 3 words in English is but one word in Greek teleo The gospel in one word
 - " to accomplish/complete, not just to end it but bring it to perfection, its destined goal"
 - o "to pay" Matt. 17:24 Rom. 13:6
- Jesus paid a price that no-one else could pay or would pay
 - o No-one else can afford our forgiveness because it requires a forever payment
 - o 30-year mortgage on a house. Note burning after completion of obligation
 - o Endless year mortgage on our sin. Forgiveness with the final eternal payment

- Jesus paid the obligation of perfection
 - He was obedient in life
 - O He always did the will of the Father. well-pleased with the Son
 - Fulfilled all righteousness
 Matt. 3:15-17
 - o A payment of perfect obedience. He never missed a payment
 - He was also obedient in death
 - Perfect in life. Perfect in death. Perfect payment
 - "Jesus paid it all, all the Him I owe...."
- Jesus paid a payment of eternal punishment
 - o What Jesus completed on the cross was not just physical and temporal...
 - It was spiritual and eternal
 - o Thousands of people suffered on Roman crosses
 - But only One suffered in the place of thousands/millions
 - o Jesus paid for not just one sinner.....but for a world of sinners
 - The cumulative suffering and compounded interest of iniquity was charged to our Surety
 - o The weight of that eternal payment would have crushed us for all eternity
 - It would never have been finished and paid....but Jesus paid it all!
 - Jesus bore the weight of our wickedness
 - He absorbed our liabilities and carried our debt
 - Of our eternal payment/punishment...Jesus says "IT IS FINISHED"
 - Only an eternal Person could make that eternal payment. Jesus paid it all
- Since Jesus paid it all we proclaim finished salvation...completed/accomplished
 - o Not a *hope so salvation*

but a *know so salvation*

Matt. 5:48

Phil. 2:8

- o Not maybe but surely not potential but actual not partial but paid
- O Not "might be saved" but "must be saved" Acts 4:12 Heb. 9:12 Heb. 10:12,14

FAITH IN WHAT IS FINISHED

- 1. We generally end our morning service with a call to have faith
 - a. The gospel proclamation had an imbedded invitation to believe the good news
- 2. A gospel invitation DOES NOT SAY
 - a. "Jesus has done all He can for you...now it is up to you..."
 - b. "Jesus did most of it, but you have to complete it"
 - c. "Jesus made salvation possible, but it is up to you to make it actual"
- 3. NO!!!!!
- a true gospel invitation says....
- a. Jesus has done it all....He has completed it all....Jesus paid it all (Jonah 2:9c)
 - i. A partial payment is not good news...not the gospel
- b. A gospel invitation declares that Jesus has finished a completed redemption for whosever believes
 - i. So, believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you shall be saved Acts 16:31
 - ii. IT IS FINISHED!
- c. Have faith in what is finished
- d. Have faith in Who finished it
