Pray for unity in the church

1 Corinthians 12:12-27 - The CHURCH as a BODY

<u>INTRO</u> - The church is an amazing institution & entity. It is a Divine institution & living entity The church is a unique creation...formed by God...enlivened by the Spirit ...and part of Christ. When God became a Man...a body was formed for Him...a body of Flesh and a Body of Faith. Ecclesiology - ekklesia = called out ones. The church has been called out of the world — holy calling The CHURCH is a group of Believers the Bible describes as a Building ... a Body ... and a Bride. Today, in our study of the church, we think about <u>The Church as a Body</u> ... the Body of Christ. When God became a Man...a body was formed for Him...a body of Flesh and a Body of Faith. (a Body of Flesh in the womb of Mary and a Body of Faith in the many members of the church.) The church is Christ's body. He is the Head, and we are its many members. By necessity, the body has much diversity among its members but also a cohesive unity. Jesus has so attached Himself to His church that He is incomplete without her....just as a head would be incomplete without a body. The Body is <u>FORMED</u> by God and each member <u>FITS</u> into a designed place with a determined <u>FUNCTION</u> which brings <u>FULLNESS</u> to the Body and to the Head.

FORMED

- 1. God is the Creator of all things. God created the church.
 - a. We were formless and void sinners....Spirit of God was hovering over... Gen. 1:2
 - b. He formed the church from the dust of the ground (as it were)
 - c. He breathed into the church the breath of life and we became alive. Gen. 2:7
- 2. The Spirit gives life to the body formed by the Father
 - a. 1 Cor. 12:13 The Spirit hovers over the waters of baptism
 - i. Not the waters of the baptistry but the waters of the new birth
 - 1. John 3:5
 - b. Eph. 4:4
- 3. Church membership is tied to the Holy Spirit's workmanship
 - a. This is symbolized in baptism (baptism makes you a member of the local body)
 - b. Only the Holy Spirit can make a church member
 - i. It takes His power...His breath... and His baptism to be in Christ's body

FITS

- When the Spirit forms the members of the body, He also fits them into a particular place
 - o 1 Cor. 12:11-12, 18
 - o Each member fits into the body. Each member has a place and a purpose
- Mr. Potato Head
 - o There are holes in the body that are designed to have a part fit into
 - o 1 Cor. 12:14-18 Feet, ears, eyes....all have a place in the body

- Being a member of the body is biblical
 - o The church is a body...... and a body has many members 1 Cor. 12:12
 - Every member has an important place in the body
 - there is hole in the body that needs to be filled by you
- Do you feel that you fit in this local body?
 - o If you are born of the Spirit, then you belong in local body
 - You fit in the Body of Faith

FUNCTION

- 1. Each member fits in the body but has a different function in the body
 - a. The body of Christ is not "cookie cutter Christianity"
 - b. God did not make us all the same. We are different for distinctive roles
 - c. 1 Cor. 12:17-18
- 2. We should celebrate our differences...our uniqueness
 - a. God creates unity from diversity, and it makes such beautiful symmetry
 - b. Look at the uni-verse! Look at creation!
 - i. Look at how we are fearfully and wonderfully made! Psalm 139:14
 - c. The church is an amazing conglomeration combined in a congregation.
- 3. We need our different functions
 - a. "Rebellion against the Stomach"
 - b. We should support our varied roles that God has for us in the body (1 Cor. 12:4-11)
 - c. We need what each member brings 1 Cor. 12:20-22
- 4. The body doesn't function well without all its members
 - a. "Inactive member" is an oxymoron

FULLNESS

- We are incomplete without each other.
 A body needs all it parts to be its best
 - o Missing members handicap the church...leave holes in the church
 - God has formed the many members to fit into one body and has assigned each member a unique function to bring fullness to the body.
 - We are only complete with each other
 - o man buried with his pickled fingerit was important to him and part of him
- Jesus is incomplete without His church.
 - o I wouldn't believe it if the Bible hadn't said it Eph. 1:22-23 (amazing mystery)
 - o Jesus has so united Himself to His church that He is incomplete without us.
 - The church is the fullness of Christ
 - He is the Head, but we are His body a body was prepared for Him
 - A body of flesh and a body of faith
 - When God became man...Jesus inextricably linked Himself to us
 - Jesus is joined to His church
- To be in the church is to be *in Christ*
 - o A Christian is attached to Christ....we are part of His body 1 Cor. 12:27
