## Ephesian 3:1-2 - Being Useful in a Painful Place

<u>Intro</u> – The problem of human suffering has perplexed people for as long as there has been people who have felt pain. Different faiths & philosophies tackle this issue with some denying its reality (Christian Science). The Christian faith acknowledges the reality of suffering and the origin of suffering (sin & The Fall). But the Christian religion is a religion of redemption. Sinners are redeemed, life & death are redeemed and even suffering is redeemed. Our faith says that pain is pain but that there is a plan and a purpose even to our pain. The painful things in our life can be redeemed for a glorious purpose within our life. The way of the cross is hard, but it is the way of redemption which leads towards a resurrection. Our text today mentions a painful situation in the life of the Apostle Paul, but Paul offers a perspective on his pain that gave purpose to the pain. The Pain ... The Perspective ... The Purpose ... of Paul's Suffering.

## THE PAIN OF PAUL'S SUFFERING

- 1. Ephesians is one of the "Prison Epistles." letters from a Roman jail.
  - a. Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon were all written from jail.
  - b. Eph. 3:1
  - c. 4 years in a Roman jail (2 yrs., in Caesarea...ship...2 yrs. in Rome Acts 21-28) i. False charges / Unjust / Chains Not fun
- 2. Apostolic resume of suffering
  - a. 2 Cor. 11:23-28
  - b. *"fought with wild beasts in Ephesus"* 1 Cor. 15:32 Philippian jail Acts 16:22-23
  - c. "bear in my body the marks" Gal. 6:17
  - d. "*Filling up...afflictions*" Col. 1:24 Paul did his share of suffering as part of the Body of Christ
    i. Christ suffered in the body and those part of His Body will also suffer.
  - e. "Despaired of life" 2 Cor. 1:8-9
- 3. The Bible does not sugar coat pain & suffering.
  - a. The pain is real, and it hurts. Suffering is burdensome and seems unbearable
  - b. Paul doesn't whitewash his suffering or redefine his pain. (C.S. or Scientology)i. We shouldn't either...Christianity deals with truth and reality
  - c. Being beaten, unjustly jailed and living in chains is not fun. (no smiley face on sorrow)

## THE PERSPECTIVE OF PAUL'S SUFFERING

- > Notice how Paul classified his imprisonment and Who he said imprisoned him.
  - <u>Eph. 3:1</u> "prisoner of Christ Jesus"
  - Eph. 4:1 "prisoner of the Lord" Eph. 6:20 "ambassador in chains"
  - Paul's perspective was that **Jesus was his jailer**.
    - Paul didn't focus on the Jews (who handed him over) or the Romans (jailed him)
    - Paul's perspective was that it was Jesus who jailed him.
    - The Hand of Providence was behind his pain.

- > See God's sovereignty in your suffering and His plan in your pain.
  - Joseph Gen. 45:5-8 (God sent me 3 x's) I'm sure Joseph didn't know the plan at first...13 yrs.
     Gen. 50:20
  - God sent the suffering and meant the suffering...
    - "God does not use anyone greatly unless He hurts him deeply."
- > Pain was part of the plan for the Apostle Paul
  - Acts 9:15-16
    - Some try to erase God from having any part in our pain. WRONG!
  - Pain is part of God's plan for us.
    - Philippians 1:29
       1 Peter 3:17
       1 Peter 4:1
       1 Peter 4:12-13
       1 Peter 4:19
  - What is your perspective on your pain? How do you classify your suffering?
    - Think of that most painful thing and ask, "Did Jesus send it?"
    - Is Jesus your "jailer"?

## THE PURPOSE OF PAUL'S SUFFERING

- Since pain was part of the plan...Paul's pain had purpose. Rom. 8:28
  - o Paul's pain was sent to him to help others. (just like Jesus' pain was the plan of redemption)
  - o 3:1 "...for the sake of you Gentiles"
- Paul was in jail because of his preaching to the Gentiles
  - Acts 21:27-28
  - Gave his personal testimony as a defense...Damascus Road experience....
    - Acts 22:14-15, 21-22
  - Paul was in jail because of the Gentiles and FOR the Gentiles.
- Paul made his pain very productive and he was useful in a hurtful place.
  - The place of his pain gave him an opportunity.
    - He preached to Gov. Felix, Gov. Festus, King Agrippa, shipmates, Malta
    - <u>Philippians 1:12-14</u> the whole praetorian guard
      - Imagine being the soldier chained to / guarding Paul Acts 28:16
    - Philippians 4:22 some of Caesars household became believers
    - <u>Philemon 10-11</u>
       The slave Onesimus was saved in prison
    - He wrote letters to churches (we are still reading them today)
    - Paul made himself very useful in a very hurtful place
      - He saw his pain as part of God's plan that had a good purpose to help others. His pain was redeemed for the good of others.
        - Paul was a good steward of his suffering Eph. 3:2
- How can we be good stewards of our pain and suffering?
  - Don't deny the reality of pain of suffering.
  - Embrace the redemption of pain and suffering
  - See Jesus as your "jailer." (have the perspective that God sent it and meant it)
  - Share in His sufferings for the good the others Philippians 3:10
    - Be useful in your hurtful place. (Why has God sent you this suffering?)
  - o Pain in this life is..... inevitable....painful...but useful
  - o Jesus is our "jailer" but also our Redeemer. Redeems sin/sinners, life/death, pain & suffering
    - Rom. 8:16-18
