CALL to PRAYER -

Thank God for your copy of the Bible

<u>Intro</u> – For the last two weeks we have addressed some important aspects of our Lord's First Coming. Our text today mentions another "coming" of Jesus, but it is not the Second Coming. This "coming" was spectacular, stunning and majestic...but guess what... all of us missed it. You see, this "coming" has already happened. Only a handful of people got to see this unique event and oh what a sight it must have been. None of us got to see it but all of us can hear about it and read it. Do you ever feel like if you had been there and seen the events when it happened that it would be better for your faith? After our Lord's resurrection, Thomas said he wouldn't believe it unless he could see and touch the wounds of the Risen One. Thomas got to see and touch but Jesus said to him in John 20:29, "Because you have seen Me, have you believed? Blessed are they who did not see, and yet believed." There is a bigger blessing for believing and not seeing. We walk by faith and not by sight. For us "seeing is not believing" but "reading is believing" and "hearing is believing." And it is better for us this way. I have two main points today. 1] The Biblical accounts are true. 2] Having the Bible is better than being there. The beginning of a New Year often brings a renewed desire to read our Bible. I want to encourage you to that end by reminding you that all the Biblical accounts are true and that having the Bible is better than being there.

2 Peter 1:16-21 - Better Than Being There

THE BIBLICAL ACCOUNTS ARE TRUE

- This passage is Peter's retelling of his experience seeing the Transfiguration
 - o Peter was an eyewitness.

1:160

- o The gospels tell us that three disciples were privileged with this experience
- Peter calls this a "coming" of the Lord Jesus Christ
 - o 1:16b a powerful coming
 - o This is a common word used for the 2nd Coming Parousia (2Peter 3:3-4; 1Thess.4:15)
 - o Jesus even called His Transfiguration a "coming" Matt. 16:28
- The Transfiguration must have been an amazing sight
 - o Matt. 17:1-8
- As Peter recounts this amazing event, he is careful to call it a true event.
 - o 2 Peter 1:16-18
 - Peter was an eyewitness (1:16)
 - Peter heard the Heaven Father's voice (1:17-18)
 - o Peter didn't embellish what happened nor was this event a work of fiction.
 - 1:16 the Transfiguration is not a cleverly devised story
- Our faith is not based on a fable and Christians should beware of infusing fairy tales when we retell the true events of the Bible.

 Our faith story is not a "fish story"
 - o 1 Tim. 1:3-4

2 Tim. 4:3-4

- o Peter said he didn't use cleverly devised fables to tell of the coming of the Lord
- o The Bible is true; it is not embellished like a tall tale or a fairy tale.
- You can believe the Bible because it is true.
